The purpose (s) of educational course/module	The aim of the course is to explain adequately specific events typical of Georgian that include - the study of main categories of verbs and their producers, infinitive and participle, noun and verb agreement rules as well as the study of typical Georgian structures; enriching basic Georgian language vocabulary; learning literary norms of Georgian language; studying the exceptions; approximation of speech and literary standard Georgian, separation of proper and improper forms; the typical (morphological, and stylistic) error analysis; the awareness of scientific text architectonics and production of business papers;					
Teaching and learning methods	Verbal or oral method; Demonstration method - a visual representation of the information; Blitz poll – answering questions regarding the studied material that contributes to understanding of the correlation between the material and its analysis; Working with books - the processing of literature; Getting additional information through informational technologies and processing the material; The method of preparing the abstract links a students with the method of working with books, in addition to this a student should get familiar with the publications, work with relevant literature, search for additional material, write abstracts;					

Presentation - students select a topic from the supplied material or independently, find the relevant material, work with the books and presents using the PowerPoint format in front of the audience.

Student's knowledge is assessed based on the 100-score system, of which 60 scores are addressed to the mid-term evaluations, and 40 scores are allocated for the final exam

Components of the mid-term assessment (total 60 scores):

- Attendance at the lecture (23X0.43)=10 scores;
- Involvement in group work-10 scores;
- Written assignment 10 scores;
- Presentation -10scores:
- Mid-term exams -20 scores;

Active participation during the group work is assessed in accordance with the following criteria (10 scores):

- **10-9 scores**—student has detailed knowledge of the theory. Is able to provide complete answers to the questions asked, provide relevant arguments and relevant examples and conduct oral presentation in the correct manner; is actively involved in group work;
- **8-7 scores**-student has knowledge of the theory, is actively ivolved in the group work, is able to provide answers to the questions asked; is able to provide general arguments, examples and conduct incomplete presentation;
- **6-5 scores-** student's knowledge of the theory is not sufficient; provides partial answers to the questions asked and argues in a simple manner; is not able to condut oral presentation;
- **4-3 scores (insufficient)** –student does not have knowledge of the theory, is not involved in the group work, is not able to provide answers to the questions asked, provide examples and conduct oral presentation;
- **2- 1 scores** there is the attempt to provide the arguments or example;
- **0 score** student is not able to provide an answer;

Abstract is assessed based on the following criteria (max. 10 scores)

- 1. The novelty of the topic 2 scores;
- **2.** Review of the available modern materials (data) related to the topic -2 scores;
- 3. The relevance of the conclusion and the connection with the main text -2 scores
- **4.** The culture of writing **2 scores**
- **5.** Visual and technical side of the written material-2 scores;

Presentation assessment criteria (max. 10 scores)

- **1.** Problem novelty 2 scores;
- **2.** Academic level 2 scores;
- **3.** Review of the available modern materials (data) related to the topic -2 scores;
- **4.** Visual and technical side of the material-2 scores;
- **5.** Culture of arguing and listening -1 score;
- **6.** Correct language and style-1 score;

Assessment Criteria

Mid-term exam is a test (multiple questions) including 10 questions with 0.5 scores and 15 question with 1 score; The student is allowed to pass the final exam, if he accumulates not less than 11 points for the midterm evaluations (considering that he/she will get the maximum score at the final exam). **Final exam** is also a test with maximum 40. It include three type of task: 10 questions (closed questions) involving 3 incorrect and one correct answer. Correct answer is one score. **20 questions** that require students full answers covering the learnt material. The assessment is the following: ❖ 1 score – a full answer ❖ 0.5 score − incomplete answer ❖ 0 score – answer is irrelevant or is not given Editing the text – 10 score The final exam is considered to be passed if the student accumulates at least 70% or more out of the maximum assessment of the exam (40X70/100=28 points). The student will be awarded the credit in case she/he accumulates minimum 51 points out of 100; Positive rate: (A) Excellent- 91 or more points; (B) Very Good- 81-90 points; (C) Good- 71-80 points; (D) Satisfactory- 61-70 point; • (E) Enough- 51-60 points; Negative rate: (FX) Failure - 41-50 points, which means that a student needs to work more and an independent and considerable further work is required to pass the exam once again to be re-awarded;

• (F) Fail - 40 points or less, which means that the student's diligence is not sufficient and student has to learn the subject all over again.

The student can pass the additional exam during the same semester. The time interval between the final and additional exams should be not less than 10 days.
