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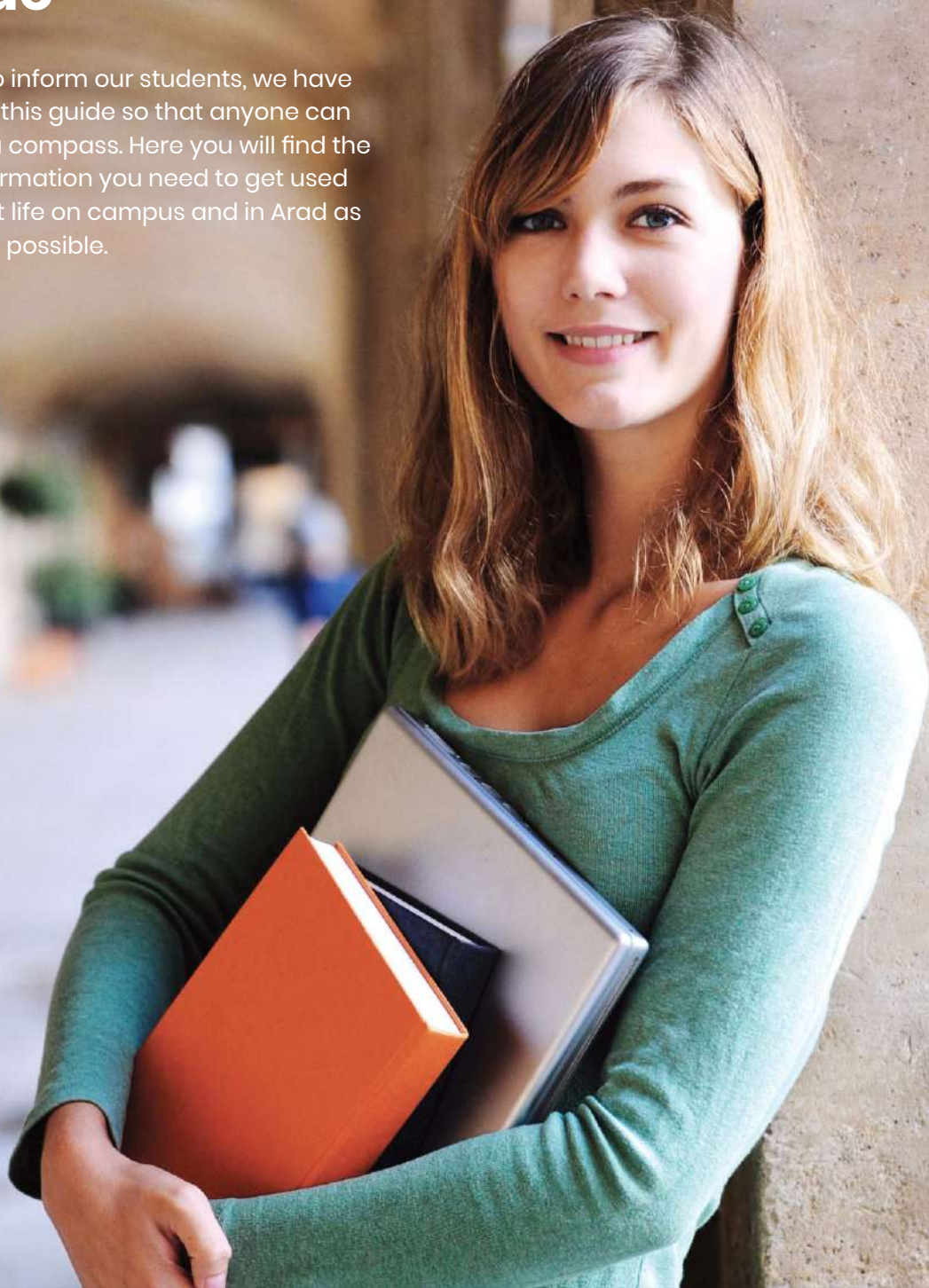
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Student Guide

UNIVERSITY MANAGEMENT

University Senate

The University Senate is the governing, decision-making and academic deliberation structure of the University. It is composed of 75% teaching and research staff and 25% student representatives.

Board of directors

It ensures the operational management of the University, having exclusive decision-making powers over the University's assets, with all related rights, as well as organisational, economic and financial regulatory, training and resource allocation powers according to priorities, in order to fulfil the mission assumed by the University.

It ensures the executive management of the University on the basis of the management contract and the institutional contract. The Rector concludes the management contract with the President of the University Senate and the institutional contract with the President of the Vasile Goldiș University Foundation of Arad. He appoints the Vice-Chancellors on the basis of consultation with the University Senate.

Council of the Faculty

It defines the development strategy, approves the curricula, proposes the number of students per specialisation and form of education, approves the subjects for the bachelor, master and doctoral examinations and validates the directors of departments.

Dean

He/she is in charge with the quality of the entire education and research process in the faculty. He / she coordinate the activity of the Faculty Council for the application of the taken decisions, appoints the vice-deans and is president of the Faculty Council.

Department Council

It is in charge with the production, transmission and capitalisation of the knowledge at department level, of the efficiency of the department teaching and research activity.

Department Directors

They perform the effective and operative management of the department. They are in charge with the curricula, the jobs descriptions, the management of the research, and of the quality.

Secretariate

They are in charge with the management of the scholar activity in the Faculty. They provide the connection with the Rector's office, with the other faculties or with the other institutions. It sends and applies the decisions of the management bodies of the Faculty and University.

In memoriam

Founding Rector

PROF. UNIV. DR.

AUREL ARDELEAN

(July 4, 1939 – December 26, 2018)

Our University was born from the ideas of Vasile Goldiș, who dreamed of a University for all the young people of Transylvania and Banat, which would give them the possibility to fulfill their destiny.

Vasile Goldiș – the spiritual patron of our University – said that a good school is one that builds character, spreads morals and plants ideals, and that "the Romanian University is for us the superior synthesis of our cultural aspirations".

Faithful to this credo enunciated by Vasile Goldiș, the founding rector of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, Prof. Aurel Ardelean, fought with ambition and determination his entire life for the promotion of quality higher education. He created from nothing a Transylvanian university, on whose frontispiece he put the name of our great statesman Vasile Goldiș. He fought to the last breath to ensure that the University he created would prosper, grow, develop and be a landmark. On this difficult road he always found himself and continued to move forward. He has worked for an open, cosmopolitan University, a welcoming home for those who discover it.

Founding Rector of the "VASILE GOLDIȘ" Western University of Arad, and later President of the University... this is how the people of Arad know Professor Aurel Ardelean, but he is

certainly much more than that. Professor Ardelean was a true "Man of the City", he was a responsible citizen, a role model for his fellow citizens, sometimes understood by them, sometimes not... If today Arad is recognized as a city of the Great Union – THE POLITICAL CAPITAL OF THE GREAT UNION – it is due to Professor Ardelean, who together with other intellectuals of Arad laid the foundations of the University of Arad which took the name of VASILE GOLDIȘ – the politician from Arad who proclaimed the GREAT UNION in Alba Iulia.

Professor Aurel Ardelean will always be present here, with us, and the Western University "VASILE GOLDIȘ", founded on his initiative, will be a testimony of HIS presence... He was a teacher by vocation, a persevering scientist, he got involved in politics being convinced that politicians must be sensitive to the real values of society... you wonder how he managed to do so many things... he was in the office very early in the morning and left the office or the university/college/research centre very late at night. He didn't spare himself or others. It was very hard to adapt to the pace of life of Professor Aurel Ardelean.

Let's not forget the family. He was a Man of the Family, trying to gather its members around him... he was the "soul" of the FAMILY, it was the one that gave him the strength to start again – every day – every initiative, idea, project.

"Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad was founded on May 2, 1990 through the efforts of a brave and enterprising group of citizens of Arad, who saw the need and opportunity to create a private higher education institution in Arad.

The credibility of these people and the sustained effort made by the founder, Professor Aurel Ardelean, at local, regional and national level have positively marked the evolution of the young university. The active involvement, dedication and sacrifices of the founding members, first of all of the founding Rector, Prof. Aurel Ardelean, as well as of the entire UVVG management, led to the establishment and development of quality higher education in Arad over the years.

The University is defined by the Charter as a community university, which is unique in Romania. The "Vasile Goldiș" University Foundation of Arad, in which the University was included, was founded with the participation of public personalities from all the structures of the local public administration: the Prefecture, the County Council, the Town Hall, the Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Agriculture, the Orthodox Bishopric, who became founding members and the University a community type University.

Thus, through its academic and scientific activity, the University is at the service of the community, contributing to the development and growth of intellectual and scientific capacity at the level of the individual, the community to which he or she belongs and society, an impact that goes far beyond the borders of Arad County.

Thus, through the constant efforts of the founding President, the University has found its way to the fulfilment of its mission, by its own forces, without any financial support from the State.

Generating and transferring knowledge to society is achieved through study programmes, scientific research and innovation, while generating added value both financially and through the cumulative social and economic impact of generations of students and graduates, the visibility and impact of its projects being noticed both in Arad and in the branches.



Throughout this period, the academic community has developed by continuing to provide the framework and the prerequisites to generate a real added value to the degree issued by UVVG, both on the labour market and at the academic level. This vision is based on the promotion of a genuine culture of quality, on the creation, dissemination and exploitation of cutting-edge knowledge, on the proactive involvement of all members of the university community and on the promotion of functional, high-performance and beneficial partnerships at national and international level.

One of UVVG's priorities is internationalisation, an essential condition for the university's prestige at national and international level. UVVG considers that the international dimension must be present in every basic process: internationalization of education, internationalization of research-innovation, expansion of international relations by placing the university in networks of national and especially international universities for joint study programmes or research programmes, adaptation of the content of study programmes to international standards and requirements, development of courses and programmes in languages of international circulation, ensuring the training of its staff, both teaching and auxiliary and administrative staff, for interaction in a language of international circulation with foreign students.

We are living at the beginning of a century of profound transformations, transformations that represent major challenges, including for university education. Today, we can say that the establishment and operation of UVVG so far have been exceptional, responding to the imperative social needs of the time: the radical change in the professions demanded on the labour market, the creation of conditions of access to higher education for Romanians amidst the decline in living standards and the exponential increase in costs related to the logistics of higher education.

These conditions that influenced the emergence and development of UVVG, as well as other higher education institutions in Romania, are gradually changing or disappearing, and the process is not a crisis, but a return to normality. The confidence of the almost 5000 students currently studying at the University, the results of the more than 100,000 graduates, the fact that 30 years after its foundation, UVVG has a scientific record of international relevance, and the international accreditation of the institution reaffirm our conviction that we are on the right track and that we are capable of achieving our goals for the benefit of the community.

About the faculty

The Faculty of Medicine, part of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, has its own mission and objectives specific to medical education, harmonized with the strategic development plan of the University, respecting and promoting the principles and objectives of the University Charter.

Among the reasons behind the initiative to set up the medical education in Arad and to establish a medical faculty in Arad, the most important are:

- the old and strong tradition of medicine in Arad;
- the interest and support of the local authorities, both the support of the local health authorities, the local public administration and other decision-makers involved;
- Arad's geographical position, which facilitates cross-border cooperation with similar institutions in neighbouring countries;

- the interest of young people from the local community in medical education (more than 40% of the students of medical faculties in neighbouring university centres came from Arad municipality or county);

The Faculty of Medicine provides a coherent educational system, diversified in terms of academic offer, with all forms of undergraduate and postgraduate education, including Residency and Doctoral School. The educational framework is varied in theoretical and practical education of future graduates, in postgraduate training programmes and in continuing medical training.

The major objective for constantly raising the quality of the teaching process is represented by the focus on student-centered methods.

Within the faculty, students can pursue two specializations: Pharmacy, IF, 5 years, accredited and Nutrition and Dietetics, IF, 3 years, with authorization to operate, a program currently undergoing accreditation. The two specializations were operating until the above mentioned date within the Faculty of Medicine, Pharmacy and Dentistry.

The Pharmacy specialization was established from the academic year 2005-2006 and the Nutrition and Dietetics specialization from the academic year 2011-2012 in response to local and European market requirements.

FACULTY OF DENTISTRY

About the faculty

The Faculty of Dentistry was established in 1991, harmoniously integrating into the structure of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, whose faculties had a predominantly humanistic profile. The study programme was accredited by HG 969 of 2000.

The idea of founding the Faculty of Dental Medicine was determined both by the old cultural-scientific traditions of our city and by the existence, since 1956, of a strong Post-Secondary School of Dental Technology, which has given the country generations of valuable specialists. Within the

a strong material base was developed and a valuable teaching staff was formed. Another factor that led to the establishment of this specialization was the special dental material base of the city of Arad, represented by four dental polyclinics with 60 working units, including the County Dental Polyclinic "Aurel Vlaicu", which at that time was one of the most modern and well equipped in the country.

The educational framework is varied, with a multi-disciplinary approach to the medical education of future graduates, their involvement in research, social, postgraduate training programmes and continuing medical education. We practice a modern, student-centred education, adapted to the requirements of the European space, by increasing the weight of practical activities and individual study and research activities. Students carry out research activities in close correlation with educational activities, sources of training in the context of integration into the European and international space.

The entire effort of the academic body is focused on the training of graduates with adequate training in the field of dental medicine and scientific research, related to European and international standards. The curricular structure and the teaching process combine the informative character of dental medical education with the formative one, allows the involvement of students in decision-making and adoption of educational strategies and curricular evaluation systems, develops the ability to work in teams.

About the faculty

The Faculty of Law of the University is the first private Law Faculty in Romania, established in 1990.

In the first years of the faculty's existence, renowned professors from the universities of Cluj and Bucharest, such as T. Drăganu, V. Hanga, M. Mureșan, I. Deleanu, L. Pop, M. Niciu, M. Basarab, A. Sida, I. Iovănaș, I. Mircea, M. N. Costin, I. Turcu, Gh. Mateuț, Gh. Nistoreanu, Gh. Botea, Al. Țiclea, who contributed to the substantial rise of the academic level of our faculty. Nowadays, the faculty's academic staff are local personalities, most of them being law practitioners, which contributes to a very good correlation of the teaching process with the requirements of the labour market and the practice in the field.

The Faculty has important international relations: the European Law Institute, the University of Vienna, the Austrian Academy of Sciences, the Universities of Krakow, Warsaw, Osnabruck, Budapest, Trnava, Zagreb, Novi Sad, etc. The faculty's students enjoy a teaching and scientific research infrastructure that meets European standards, including forensic and modern language laboratories, the European Information and Integration Centre, the Human Rights Protection Office, the legal informatics and computer law laboratory, the Central University Library "Tudor Arghezi", the premises for the training of students within the FEDE (European Federation of Higher Education Institutions).

The educational offer of the faculty includes the bachelor's degree, with a duration of 4 years, and the master's degree, in the fields of Institutions of Civil Law and Civil Procedure and Institutions of Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure. The faculty also provides postgraduate training and continuous professional development programmes for the knowledge and deepening of the new Romanian codes.

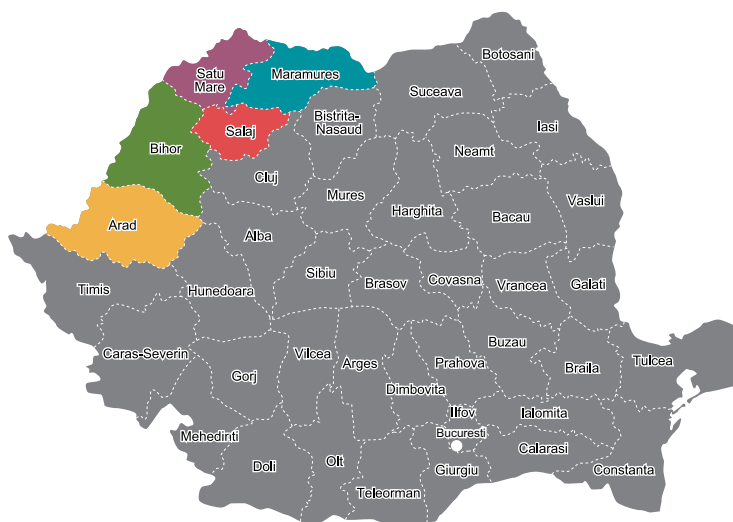

STUDENT REPRESENTATION

Because it is impossible for the more than 6,000 students of "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad to express their opinions at the same time, the students' interests are brought to the attention of the management through representatives. There are several ways to be represented in the management structures, depending on the level:



At university level

In the University Senate, the highest governing body, a quarter of the membership is made up of student representatives, as in the faculties. So decisions at University level are not made without taking your interests into account, communicated to the University management through your representatives.

At faculty level

In each college, you can choose one or more students to represent you. Elections to become a student representative on a faculty's board are open to any student enrolled in the IF with good grades (it is not a condition that they even come first in their studies). The role of these representatives is to attend regular meetings held by the Faculty Council and to communicate your views to the Faculty Council members. And this is taken seriously by the faculty, because they form no less than a quarter of the total number of members in the Faculty Council, so no decision can be taken without consulting them.

Why become a representative?

Student representatives in the Faculty Council and Senate:

- may propose legislation to improve the work of their colleagues;
- can directly inform themselves from the academic and administrative structures of the University on issues concerning students;
- have permanent access to the secretariats and outside office hours with the public to solve students' problems.



STUDENT ASSOCIATIONS

The Students' Consultative Council

Student Advisory Council (SAC) - It functions as an integrated part of the University structure, aiming to represent, inform and involve students in academic management, extracurricular and community activities, and to mediate relations between teachers and students.

The Student Advisory Council is chaired by the Student Prefect, elected by secret ballot by simple majority for a 2-year term. Student Organization "Vasile Goldiș" - It is the non-governmental organization with the right to represent and defend student interests in relation to the management of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad. It carries out social, cultural, professional, economic and civic engagement activities, fighting for the unity of student life, in support of autonomy and university cooperation.

The "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad also encourages and supports student associations on different profiles such as: Arad Medical Students Association - Medicine; Medical Students Union; Aiesec Arad - Leadership; Elsa Arad - Law, and others.



Why be a member of the students' association?

Belonging to a student association means more than just it seems, giving you options, benefits and other rewards that can be proven and rewarded through your efforts so that you feel a sense of satisfaction in the work you put in and the interest you take in the activities supported by the student associations you belong to. Among the benefits the most significant ones can be listed, namely:

- 1.** Gives you the opportunity to do something useful and enjoyable in your free time and be something more than the typical student who goes to class, seminars and labs.
- 2.** Working in an association does not follow a programme a fixed one, like a job or an internship, but a flexible one, but varied enough that you never get bored.
- 3.** It is a very good source to gain that "experience" so sought after by employers even when it comes to fresh graduates.
- 4.** You can acquire or improve skills that are very useful not only in the job market but also in social life: teamwork, communication and presentation skills, event organisation.
- 5.** You get to know people who can make your life more beautiful through their diversity and dedication.
- 6.** Through a project of the association you can go abroad through youth exchanges, summer schools, training, conferences, etc.
- 7.** Often, among the former members you keep in touch with are managers or directors of companies in the sector, whom you can impress with your skills and present yourself to after graduation with a CV in your briefcase.



What is the Bologna Process?

The Bologna Process is about making higher education systems in European countries compatible. The Bologna Declaration (1999), signed by education ministers from European countries, including Romania, created the European Higher Education Area. Here are some of the general changes that have affected Romanian university education:

- changing the length and structure of studies;
- reducing the length of the undergraduate cycle;
- increasing the length and importance of the master's degree;
- the transformation of short courses (college) into undergraduate courses;
- restructuring the doctoral system;
- changing the structure of specialisations;
- promoting student and teacher mobility;
- recognition of diplomas at European level;

Further studies are needed undergraduate studies with a master's degree?

The main purpose of initial university training (bachelor's level) is employment on the labour market in executive activities requiring higher-level qualifications. Continuing your undergraduate studies with a master's degree is extremely useful, as a master's degree enhances your skills, through specialisation or further training, so that you can be employed in positions involving management, decision-making and creative activities.

On the other hand, a Master's degree opens the way to a PhD for the most successful students. Through the diversity of the Master's programmes offered by the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, by the possibility of accessing them at different moments of your professional career, continuous lifelong learning and the possibility of professional conversion according to market requirements are ensured.



To what extent is student mobility promoted by the Bologna Process? Will I be able to move from a university to another?

Mobility of students and graduates, studying at universities abroad, is ensured by the Lifelong Learning Programme and other inter-university agreements. In addition to these programmes, the new system encourages student mobility between faculties and universities at home and abroad by:

- description of studies in terms of transferable credits;
- the transparency of studies completed and diplomas obtained;



USEFUL INFORMATION FOR **UVVG STUDENTS**

Extract from the Regulation on the professional activity of students and master students

Art.3

(1) An academic year is structured in two semesters, each semester having 14 weeks of teaching activities followed by an exam session of at least 3 weeks, a 2 week rest session and a credit recovery session organised with the approval of the Senate, lasting 1-2 weeks.

(2) The final semester of studies may have less than 14 weeks of teaching activities. If the final semester has less than 14 weeks of teaching activities, the remaining weeks are allocated for internship in order to complete the diploma project/undergraduate thesis/dissertation.

Art.7

(1) In all faculties the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) is obligatorily applied intra- and inter-university (internal, external). This system ensures the mobility of students and the flexibility of their professional training.

(2) Credits are defined as numerical values assigned to units of courses and other teaching activities, which assess the average amount of work done by the student to master a subject.

(3) The system of credit allocation shall be determined at the level of the Faculty Councils, in accordance with the specific teaching activity.

**Art 55**

The enrolment of students in a complementary year and the approval of the resumption of studies by students who have had requests to interrupt their studies does not constitute exceeding the approved enrolment figure.

Art. 56

A student may repeat a year of study no more than twice. If he fails to pass after two repetitions, he will be expelled and his academic record will be released.

Art. 57

Under the conditions of promotion of the year of study, the remaining credits of the previous year can be made up in the following year of study, but only within the same cycle.

Art. 58

(1) Promotion in the second cycle of studies (years IV-VI), in the case of Medicine, Medicine (in French), Medicine (in English), Dental Medicine programmes, requires passing all the examinations related to years I-III of studies (obtaining the 180 compulsory credits) and in the case of Pharmacy programme, passing all the examinations related to years I-II of studies (obtaining the 120 compulsory credits).

(2) If the student has one or more outstanding examinations, but not more than 15 outstanding credits from the third year of study or second year of study in the case of the Pharmacy programme, these can only be taken in a complementary year with fees, at the student's request. The complementary year extends the total duration of the studies, the students' teaching obligations being strictly limited to the repetition of non-promoted subjects and any difference exams resulting from the alignment of the curriculum with the current year.

(3) Students in their third year of study in the programs Medicine, Medicine (in French), Medicine (in English), Dental Medicine who do not obtain a minimum of 45 credits in their third year of study will not be able to be enrolled in a complementary year; they will be able to apply for a repeat year of study with full payment of the tuition fee for that year.

(4) Students in the second year of study in the Pharmacy programme who do not obtain a minimum of 45 credits in the second year of study may not be enrolled in a complementary year; they may apply to repeat the year of study with full payment of the tuition fee for that year.

(5) Only students in their third or sixth year of study in the programmes Medicine, Medicine (in French), Medicine (in English), Dentistry, students in their second or fifth year of study in the programme Pharmacy, students in their fourth year of study in the programmes Law and Forestry and students in their third year (final year) of all other study programmes are eligible for enrolment in an additional year.

(6) Students enrolled in other years of study, in case of failure to pass the number of credits required for passing the respective year of study, will be able to submit by 15 September a request to repeat the year of study, with full payment of the tuition fee for the respective year of study and with the obligation to meet the curriculum requirements of the class with which they are repeating their studies.

About ERASMUS +

The new Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme offers opportunities for study periods abroad, internships, apprenticeships and staff exchanges in all fields of education, training, youth and sport.

It is open to pupils, students in higher education and vocational education and training, adult learners, youth exchanges, youth workers and sports coaches.

The main features of Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme are:

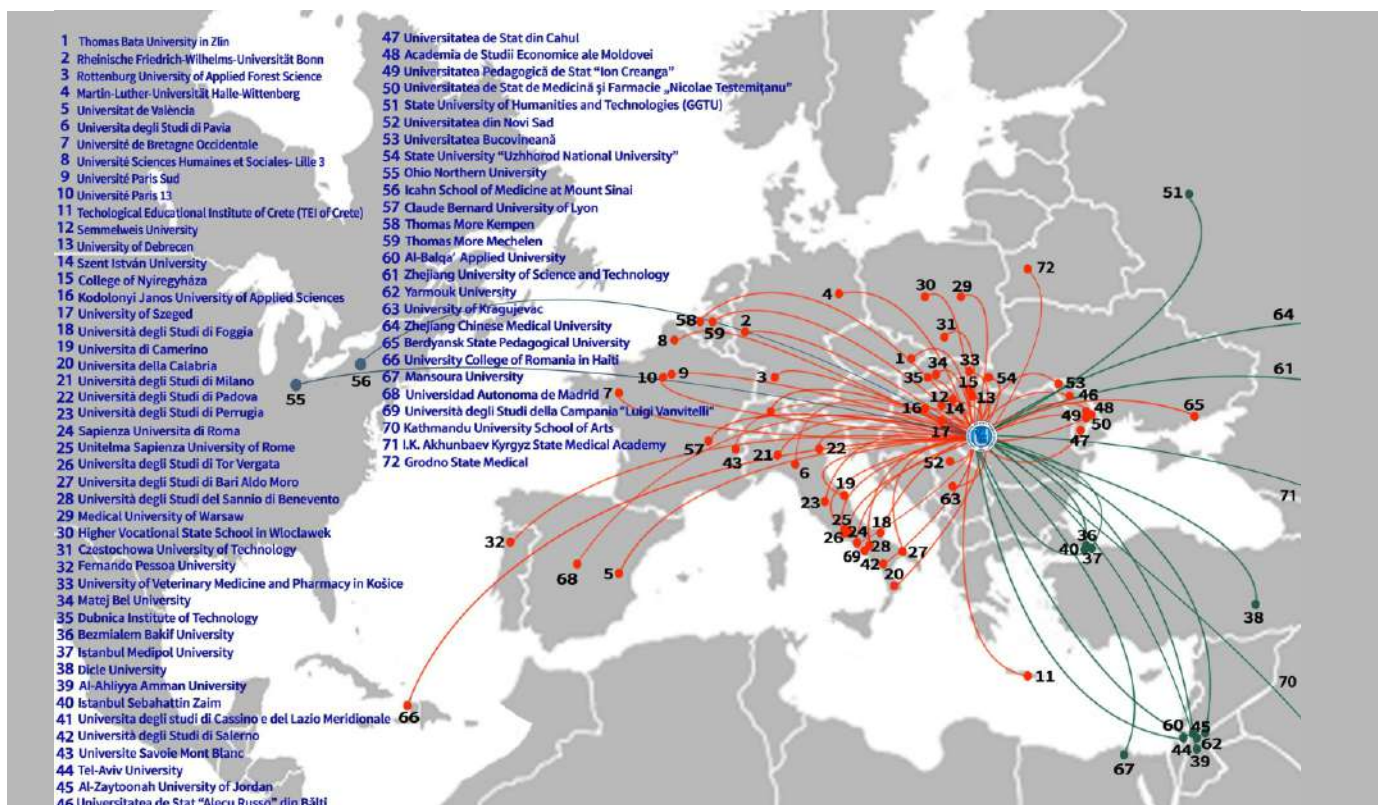


Green Erasmus +

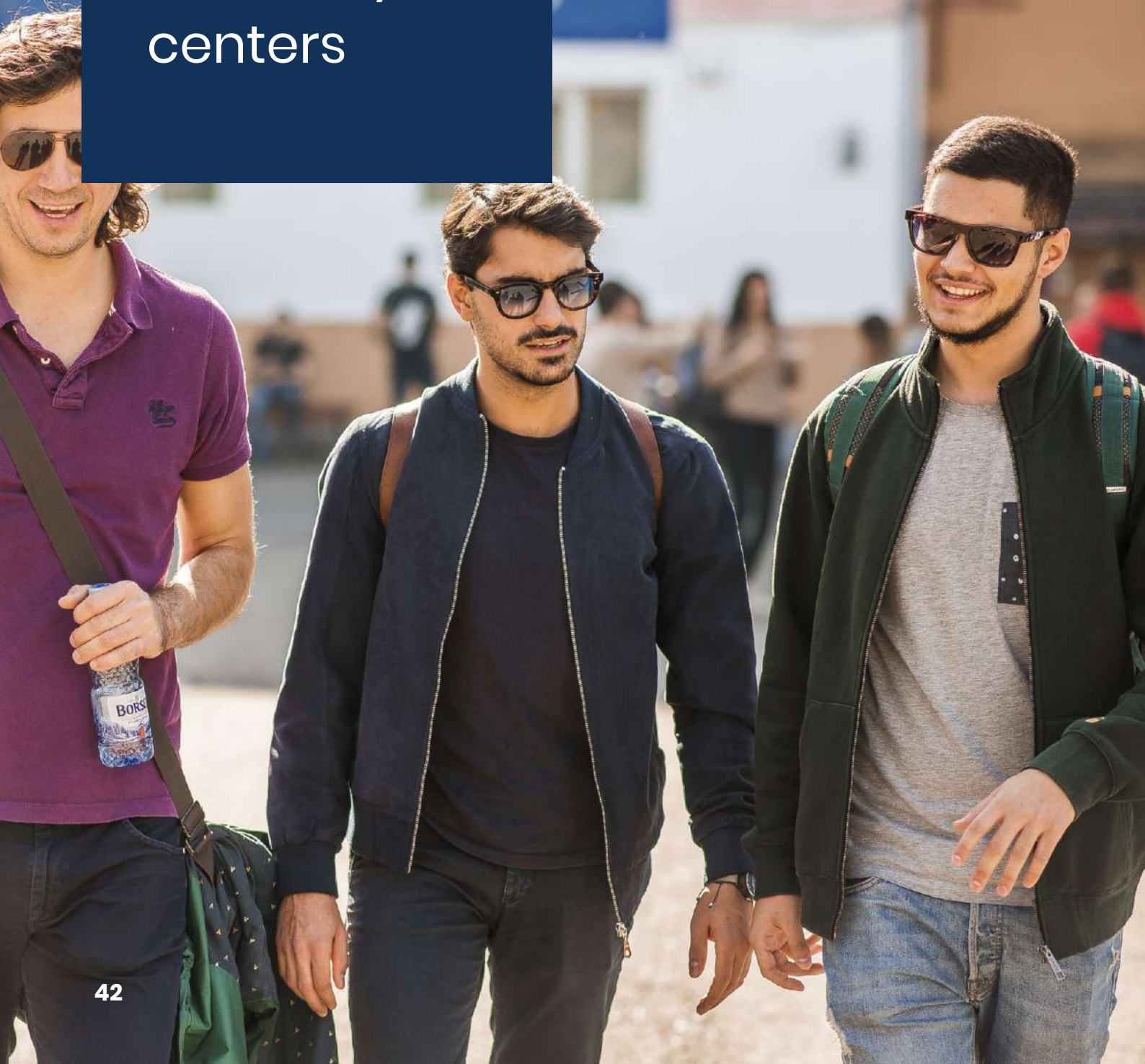

CENTRE

Since 1992, the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad is member of F.E.D.E. (The European Federation of Higher Education Schools) which is an international nongovernmental organization, with participatory statute at the Council of Europe. Prof. Aurel Ardelean, the President of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, is also vicepresident of this European body.

Reuniting hundreds of independent higher education institutions of the countries members of the Council of Europe, the Federation contributes in achieving a unique European academic area by educational programs concluded with exams on unique subjects for all member schools.

In figures, there are over 600 member schools in France and Europe. Organized by the norms and recommendations published by the European Union and by the Council of Europe, the exams after which the students receive diplomas or certificates are accessible for high school pupils in terminal grades, and for undergraduates and graduates.

The F.E.D.E. diplomas provide an extraopportunity for employment in the European area. Through the FEDE Department, the students of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, and other willing persons have access to the following diplomas:

1. Certificate of Culture and Citizenship Citizenship

This certificate enables students to develop their knowledge of European culture and citizenship and is of real use in all professions in the European area, thus meeting the requirements of European employers.

2. European Language Certificate

The European Language Certificate is a real advantage for students, as the certification of foreign language skills is a basic requirement for obtaining a job both in Romania and in any other European country.

INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE TESTING CENTRE

About the testing centre

The International Centre for Language Testing, Evaluation and Academic Counseling (C.I.T.L.E.C.A.) established after an acute need for evaluation and recognition of the language skills, by awarding certificates with wide national and, in particular, international coverage:

IELTS Test

(International English Language Testing System) - is a mandatory requirement for immigration to Canada, Australia, New Zealand.

TOEFL Test

(Test of English as a Foreign Language) measures candidates' ability to communicate in English at colleges and universities. It is recognised by over 6,000 institutions in more than 130 countries, enjoying the widest recognition among English language tests worldwide. It is available in both classic paper-based (PBT) and online (iBT) formats.

TOEIC Test

(Test of English for International Communication) assesses the English language proficiency of any person, as used in everyday activities, but it is especially required for those working in an international environment or for young people and students who want to find a job, anyone interested in this type of certification.

BMAT Test

It has three sections and is aimed at those interested in general or veterinary medicine at Oxford and Cambridge centres; it lasts two hours, assesses skills, abilities, scientific and practical knowledge.

ELAT

Required for those wishing to apply to a major in modern or classical literature at Oxford; takes 90 minutes, consists of a comparative essay on two or three themes of prose or poetry.

TSA

Required by Oxford/Cambridge for those wishing to study philosophy, politics and economics; lasts two hours, structured in two sections: the first assesses critical thinking and the second requirement is the formulation of an essay on a given topic.

STEP

Required for high school graduates wishing to study mathematics at Oxford and Cambridge.

Another type of testing is the tests organized and administered under the auspices of Collegeboard and Educational Testing Service USA, namely:

LSAT

Administered four times a year in centres around the world, including the one in Arad.

GRE

Standardized test required for admission to U.S. schools, master's degrees, doctorates; centered on a test of abstract thinking in mathematics, vocabulary, and analytical texts.

ECL

European Consortium for Languages, is administered 3 times a year for English, German, French and Romanian.

The British Language Centre, or BLC-UVVG Centre, offers Cambridge tests and Cambridge test preparation modules (all levels) at the lowest prices in the country, in partnership with Cambridge University, one of the top three universities in the world, according to accredited rankings. The BLC-UVVG centre is the only Cambridge University authorised centre in Arad county, with authorisation number RO 067.

The exams offered are paper-based or computer-based, with a monthly frequency, as follows:

BEC Test

Business English Certificates: BEC Preliminary (B1) BEC, BEC Vantage (B2) and BEC Higher (C1);

ILEC Test

Cambridge Legal (ILEC, International Legal English Certificate) – attests to language skills in the use by lawyers and lawyers;

Cambridge BULATS

(Business Language Testing Services) tests professional communication skills needed in a business environment and is used by companies in more than 30 countries for recruitment, training and professional development of employees (test can be taken for English, French, German and Spanish);

Cambridge ICFE

Cambridge Financial (ICFE, International Certificate in Financial English) tests language skills for the accounting environment and finance/banking.



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E.C.D.L. CENTER

The ECDL (European Computer Driving Licence) Accredited Testing Centre at the "Vasile Goldiș" University of Arad has been operating since June 2002, being the sixth accredited centre in the country.

Since its establishment, more than 700 people have been certified at the centre, employees of local and county government institutions, students from Arad high schools, students and other people interested in obtaining digital skills. The E.C.D.L. standard is the most widespread internationally recognised standard for the certification of computer skills.

The E.C.D.L. is used and recognised in 150 countries by leading companies, government and prestigious educational institutions. The centre regularly organises E.C.D.L. courses and tests on the following modules: computer use, online tools, text editing, spreadsheet, presentations, databases, web editing, image editing, IT security and 2D CAD.





LIFELONG CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CENTRE

Established in September 2012, the Lifelong Career Counselling and Guidance Centre of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad addresses its activities to students and graduates of the university, high school seniors, teaching and non-teaching staff of the university.

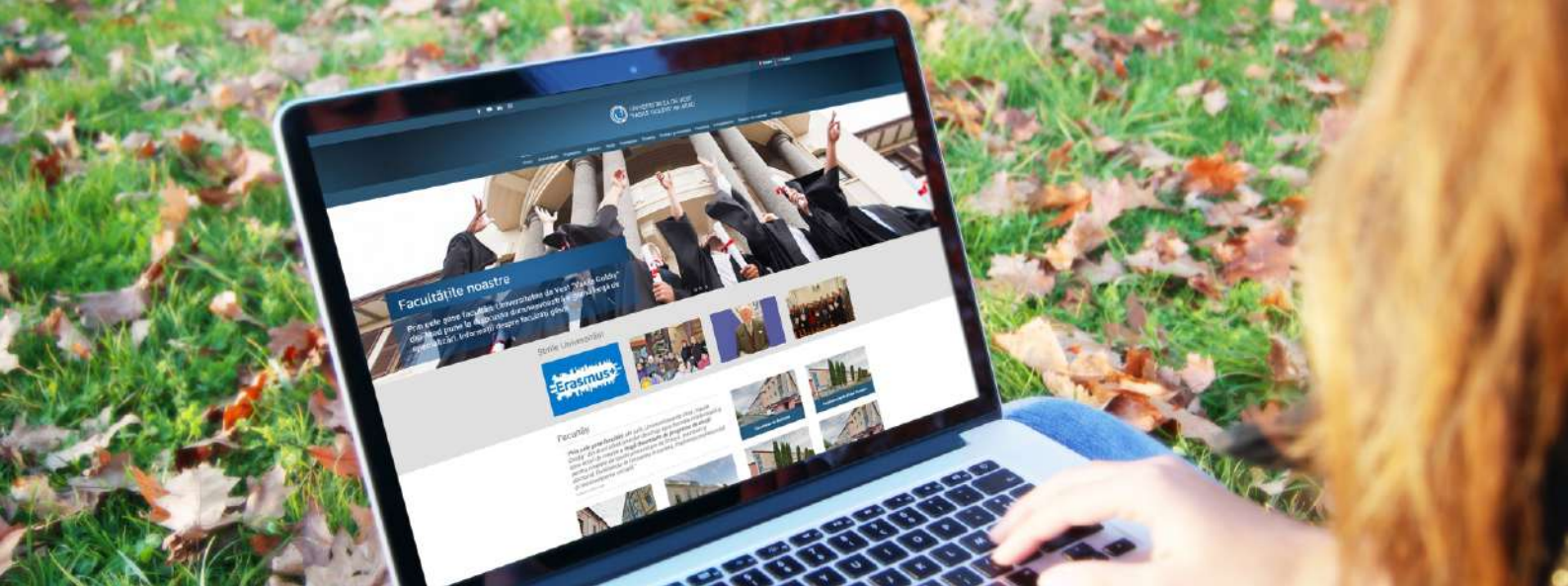

The student management platform in which client applications are used to carry out all student management operations in the secretariat from enrolment to graduation, with the recording of educational plans and school reports, as well as student financial statements. The system also benefits from an online component, where students can consult their academic and financial statements, and through integration with the Euplatesc.ro online payment system, students can pay their fees online through this platform. The system also has an Alumni component, which becomes active and visible for every student who becomes a graduate.

Exam platform

The uvvg.ro exams platform is a platform developed on the Moodle solution for computer-based exams, accessible only from the university laboratories.

Courses platform

The cursuri.uvvg.ro platform is an e-learning platform of the university, developed on the Moodle solution. Here are posted the course materials and other useful materials for students, grouped by faculty, specialization, form of education, year of study. Each student has access only to their own courses.

E-mail service

Email service @student.uvvg.ro: all students can benefit from an email address of type număr_matricol@student.uvvg.ro which they can use for communication within the university, both during their studies and after graduation. The solution is based on the Google Education system.

Portal platform

The uvvg.ro portal platform is a portal developed on the Moodle solution, on which the multi-criteria evaluation system for teaching staff, student satisfaction questionnaires and the virtual secretariats of the faculties are currently implemented.

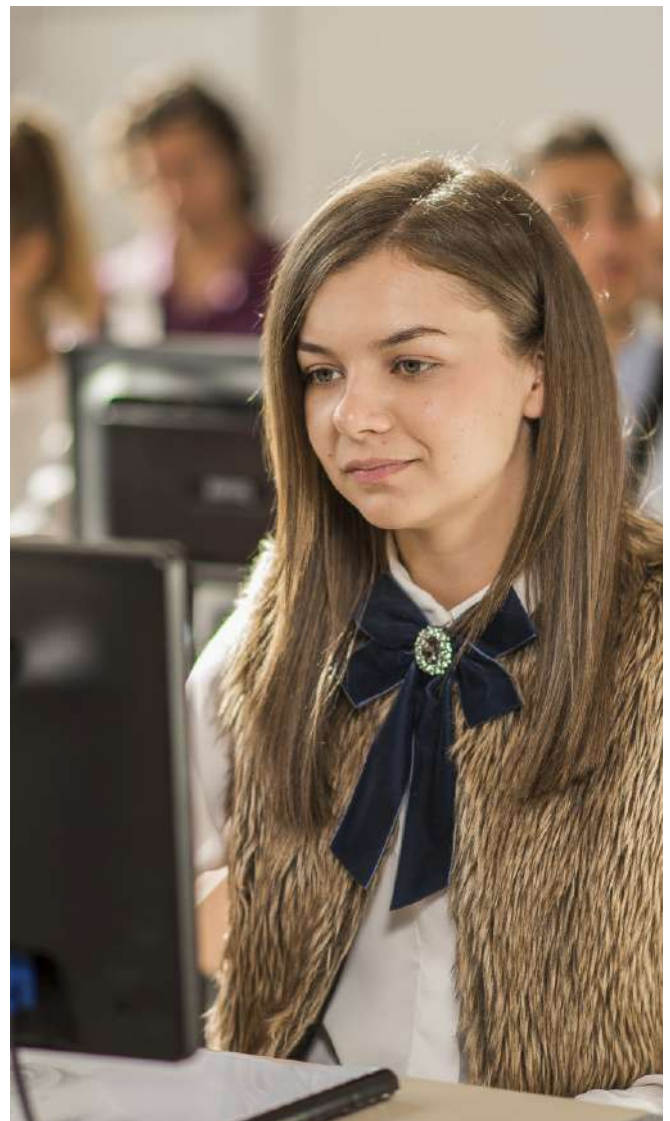
Academic Identity Cards (with access control functionality) for UVVGA students are issued in partnership with ISIC (International Student Identity Card) and will help you with:

THE "ROMÂNUL" PALACE **VASILE GOLDIȘ HOUSE**

The Romanian Palace in Arad is a building built in the 19th century in eclectic style under the direction of Vasile Goldiș. It was used at the time as the residence of Vasile Goldiș, where the editorial office of the newspaper "Românul" and the publishing house - "Concordia" printing house were located. Vasile Goldiș, one of the architects of the Great Union, wrote and published in the newspaper "Românul" - of which he was the director - the convocation of the National Assembly of Alba Iulia, and on December 1, 1918 he read in front of the "Great National Assembly", the resolution of the Great National Assembly of Alba Iulia, a resolution that he also drafted for the most part - the birth of the modern Romanian national state.



Today, ten of the rooms of the "Romanian" Palace house the University Memorial Museum

"Vasile Goldiș" Memorial Museum, set up on the private initiative of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad and officially inaugurated in 2003 in the presence of the President of Romania.

For the first time, the celebrations of the Great Union (85th anniversary of the Great Union) started from Arad, the place where the Great Union was conceived and designed. Another part of the spaces in the building are housing and business premises.

"VASILE GOLDIȘ" UNIVERSITY MEMORIAL MUSEUM IN ARAD

On 30th November 2003, in front of the "Românul" Palace, in a festive atmosphere, the President of Romania, His Excellency Mr. Ion Iliescu, in the presence of the Rector of the University, Prof. Aurel Ardelean, members of the University Senate, local officials and students, unveiled a commemorative plaque placed in honour of VASILE GOLDIȘ; the "Vasile Goldiș" University Memorial Museum was thus inaugurated, an exceptional cultural edifice of contemporary Arad.

"In appreciation of the effort made to preserve and promote the memory of the events and participants in the achievement of national unity and the modern Romanian state, contributing to the defence and perpetuation of the values

In the name of which the Great Union was achieved (DECREE no. 824 of 13.11.2019 / CMU PATENT no.18) In turn, President Klaus Iohannis awarded the Anniversary Medal "Centenary of the Great Union" - to the "Vasile Goldiș" University Memorial Museum of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad.

"The "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad welcomes and is pleased with this extremely honourable distinction. We thank the Presidency of Romania and President Klaus Iohannis for awarding the Anniversary Medal "Centenary of the Great Union".

With great accuracy, the team that has engaged in this cultural approach has tried, starting from a post-modern paradigm in the approach to history: that of moving from simple evocation and reconstruction, to the reiteration through reactualization of a historical time, of an atmosphere, of that "modus vivendi" proper to each historical "zone".

The idea was to confront time, in the manner that has long existed in all European museums, allowing the sliver of life that shaped the great moments experienced in the Romanian Palace, when the strategy of the Great Union was being developed here. We have tried to capture something of the lifestyle of those who lived there, of the struggles of that cultural life at the editorial office of a publication that made history.

Those who cross the threshold of this house should be captivated by the idea of this reiteration: of times that exceptional personalities shaped, emerging from the burden of time.



THE MUSEUM'S NEW WING

On 1st December 2008, on the occasion of the 90th anniversary of the most important political act of the modern era: the achievement of national state unity on 1st December 1918, four more exhibition rooms were inaugurated; several exhibits were added, donated by Vasile Goldiș's family or purchased from participants in the Alba Iulia Assembly, including the press of the time. This continuation of the museum makes it a true temple of the GREAT UNION, because the exhibits, plans and documents "speak" primarily of the period after the achievement of the Great Union: 1918 - 1938. This is the period in which the benefits of the Act of 1 December 1918 can be seen; we come into contact with a ROMANIA in full economic expansion, but also with a ROMANIA that had to harmonise its policies in the territories on the slopes of the Carpathian Mountains.

The exhibition includes original documents and objects belonging to Roman Ciorogariu, Vasile Goldiș, Ștefan Cicio Pop and Ioan Suci. Some of the original documents kept in the museum are in the custody of the Arad Museum Complex; in fact, there has been a beneficial collaboration between the two cultural institutions for many years, both being involved in the organization of cultural events beneficial to the community of Arad. The maps drawn up on the basis of documents of the time (1918-1938) show the demographic and economic expansion of an area, the Arad area, which benefited greatly from the benefits of the Great Union.

In 2014, the museum's exhibition was enriched with a part of the ASTRA Arădeană Library, Vasile Goldiș being one of those who led the Cultural Association of Romanians, an association that was fully involved in raising and preserving the "national spirit" that generated stability in the struggle for national unity, but also for intellectual development in the following period.

The entrance to this part of the museum reflects the demographic and economic expansion of Arad. Numerous advertisements of Romanian, German, Hungarian and Jewish manufacturers and merchants are presented; statistical data and the population's allocation to districts show the economic expansion of an area that became increasingly beneficial for the Romanian population in the period immediately following the achievement of national unity.





"VASILE GOLDIȘ" UNION HALL

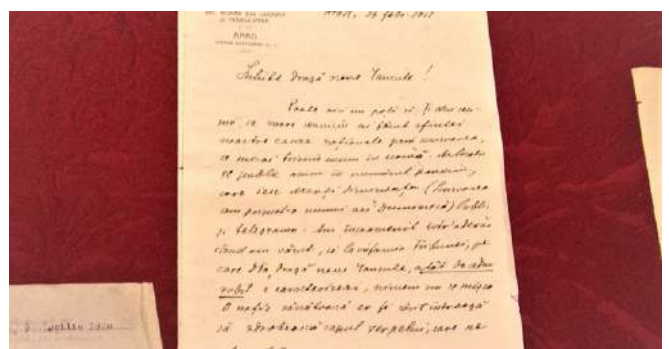
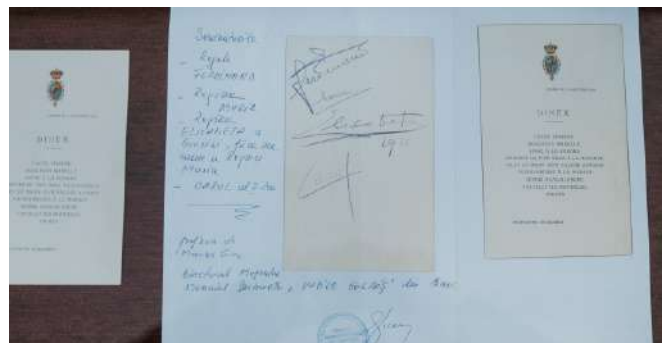
The year 2018 – the CENTENARY YEAR – was a good opportunity for the university to inaugurate a new exhibition space: the "Vasile Goldiș" Union Hall, a generous space also intended for the organization of cultural events: communication sessions, symposia, book launches, conferences, history classes for pupils or students ... given the audio-video technical equipment of the hall. The "Vasile Goldiș" Union Hall has numerous documents, some of them unique, displayed in elegant showcases:

- Vasile Goldiș's prayer book "Little Acaftist Into the Greatness of God" (in leather covers) which he held to his chest when he read the Resolution of the Great Union of Alba Iulia; Wilhelm Kraft publishing house, Sibiu, 1918 - volume received by Vasile Goldiș in Alba Iulia;

- The Reception Menu (in French), on the second page of the Menu are the signatures of King Ferdinand, Queen Mary, Queen Elizabeth of Greece – Queen Mary's eldest daughter and the future King Charles II;

- Family letter, addressed by Vasile Goldiș to some of his grandchildren, dated 17 June 1930 – it relates the Goldiș family's visit to France for health reasons;

- "NOUL TESTAMENT", Bucharest, 1925; "I received as a souvenir from Averescu. 1926" – Signed: Vasile Goldiș, Deputy of Radna, Pecica, Ineu;





"ACADEMICIAN NICOLAE CAJAL"

CENTER FOR JEWISH STUDIES

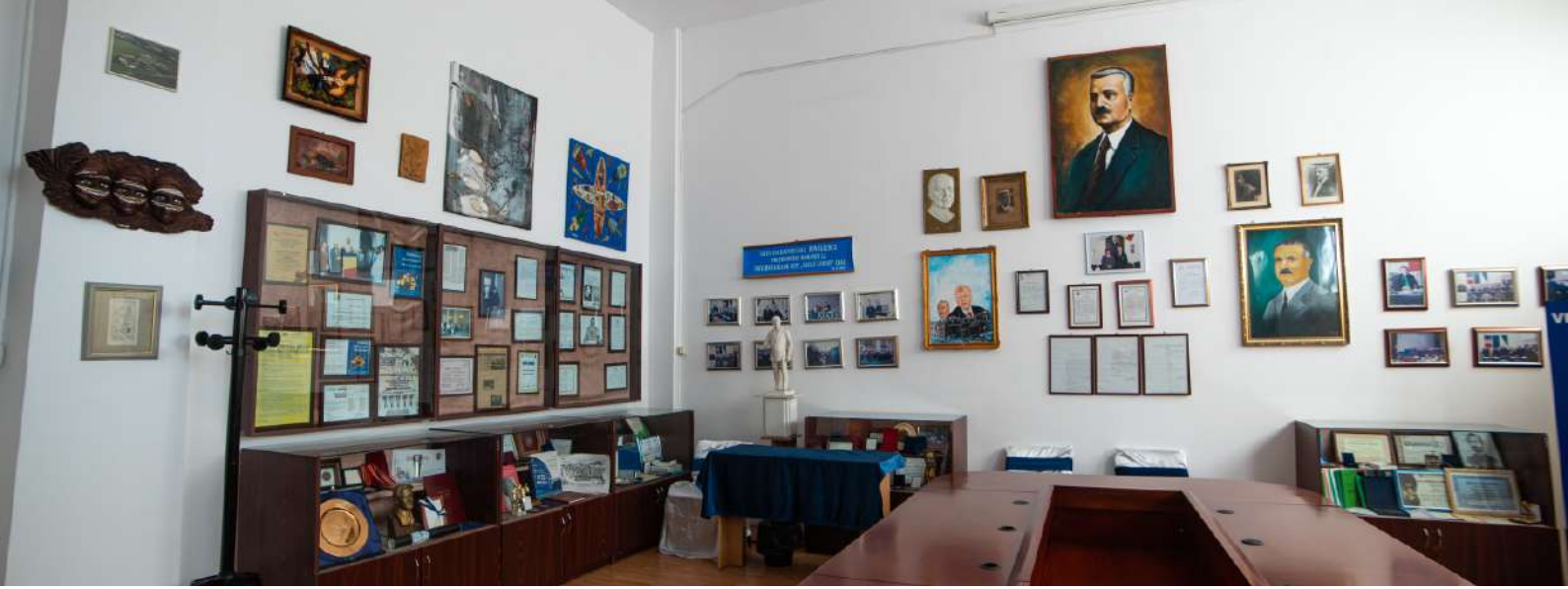
At the end of March 2004, at the initiative of the founding rector Prof. AUREL ARDELEAN, the Centre for Judaic Studies was opened at the UVVG, which in 2010 will be named Academician Nicolae CAJAL. The need to set up a Centre for Judaic Studies in Arad has become a priority of the academic community of Arad - especially of the one gravitating around the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, as a result of the important changes that are occurring in the collective mentalities in the strictly contemporary era. In line with the most recent philosophical and historical conceptions, a new junction between Judaism and Christianity has been produced; contemporary history has been forced, through new knowledge and orientations, to abandon some millennia-old prejudices, moving on to the recognition of the extent of the history of the Jewish people.

The Jews took Jesus as the one who came out of their ranks with a message for the Jews. The great Churches of the contemporary world (Orthodox, Catholic, Protestant) take up Jesus the Jew, the expression of the great culture of Israel. Sustained historical investigation of the Bible is necessary for a deeper understanding of it. It is a clear signal of the shift from interculturality to multiculturalism. The initiative to set up this Centre also meets the trends evident in the Ministry of Education, which supports research focusing on some crucial issues of contemporary history, such as the study of the Holocaust.

The opening of the Centre for Judaic Studies is a first step towards the re-evaluation of Jewish culture. Even though the number of Jews in Romania today has drastically decreased (according to the last census the Jewish population represents only 0.04% of the country's population), the cultural value of the activities of the communities in Romania is indisputable; if we add to this the troubled multi-millennial history of the Jewish people, the exceptional value of the individual achievements of some outstanding members of the ethnic group in the scientific field, the "hot zone" that is still the Near East, we have a relatively complete but still pale picture of what Judaism represents in contemporary society.

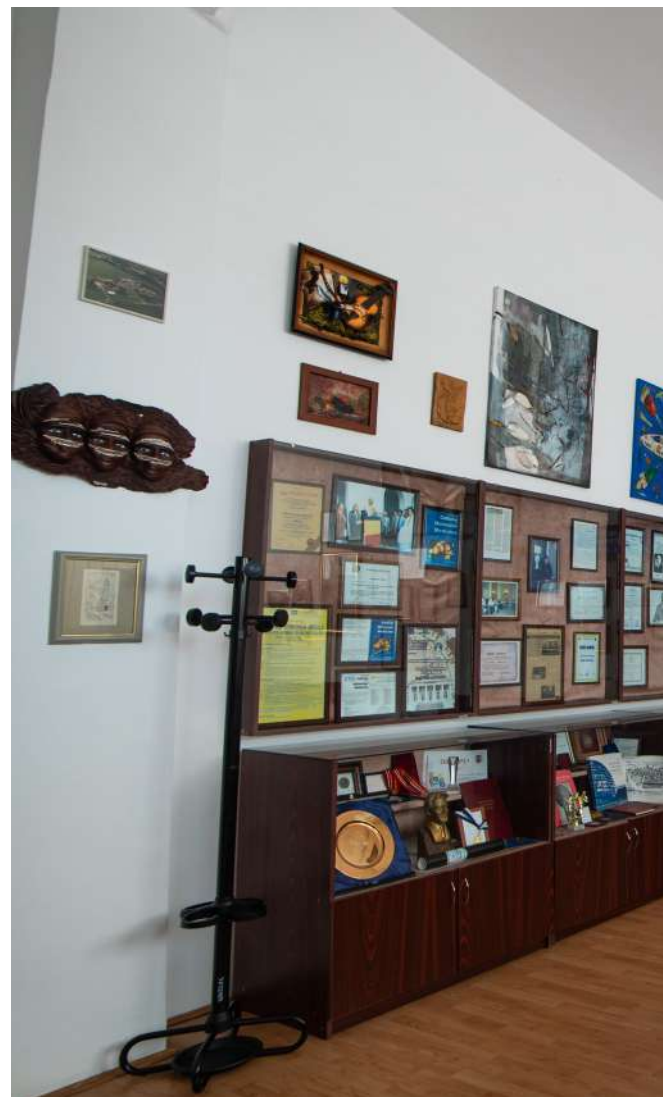






UNIVERSITY MUSEUM

A project of the Rector, Prof. Dr. Coralia Adina Cotoraci, the work space of the Founding Rector, Prof. Dr. Aurel Ardelean, has been redesigned, thought and structured as an image of the life of a perfectly accomplished man, both humanly, familiarly and scientifically,

The books that marked his life and career, documents from the history of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad, evidence of the recognition of the scientific activity of his Lordship and of the university on a national and international level, family pictures, as well as the area of passions and hobbies: sports, sport hunting, travels with the memories brought back - the collection of over 1200 spoons.



Library

It includes an impressive collection (more than 2000 books - starting with courses from the student years, basic treatises for the training of specialists in life sciences, general and molecular biology, a special collection of international literature on evolution, atlases and dictionaries from the most diverse fields, pedagogical and didactic works, collections of specialized periodicals, Romanian and foreign literature, art albums.



TUDOR ARGHEZI UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

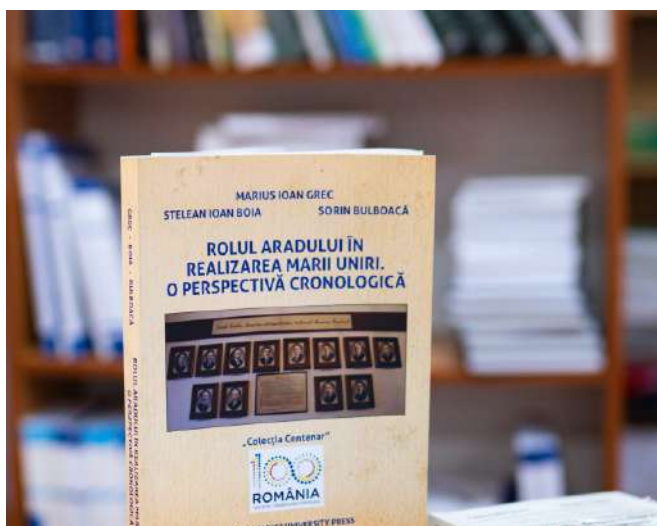


The "Tudor Arghezi" University Library of the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad is constituted as a system consisting of the central unit and 18 specialized units (faculty libraries, department libraries, study and research centres and the libraries of the University's branches) and through the digitization of the online catalogue, it offers free access to thousands of digital documents.

Thus, it forms the necessary documentary base for the academic community through free access to a wide variety of information resources: more than 570,000 volumes (100500 titles), 77 subscriptions to national and international journals, 11 databases: Science Direct Freedom Collection Journals, ACCES, Springerlink Journals, Thomson Web of Knowledge, Sage Journals HSS, Wiley Journals, Science Direct Archives, Springer Archives, Thomson Web of Knowledge Archives, Wiley Archives, Science Direct Current Archives 2016, LEGIS.

More than 80% of titles are on open access shelf system, the reading rooms are equipped with modern computing technology - 45 computers connected to the internet, unlimited wi-fi access, more than 500 seats in the reading rooms and individual study.

The book stock is encyclopaedic in the Reference Room and specialised in the faculty libraries: legal, medical, economic, socio-human.





ARGHEZI ART COLLECTION AND OFFICE

BARUTU T. ARGHEZI MEMORIAL OFFICE

In the centre of Arad, in one of the Secession 1900 palaces, specific to the local architecture, the University and Student House has been operating since 2006.

and a space dedicated to the writer's son:

"Arghezi" Art Collection

Donated by the Doina and Baruțu T. Arghezi family, the exhibition includes art objects of the most diverse genres: furniture pieces, carpets, decorative glass, porcelain and earthenware, silverware, tapestries and paintings, from the 16th to the 20th century, mostly of European origin, but also from China and the Orient.

The glass pieces (white, blue, red, green, layered, Florentine, paste, opaline crystal) as well as porcelain, earthenware and stoneware are reference objects for the craftsmen and workshops, country or era they represent. They are exceptionally varied decorative objects, but also everyday objects such as tableware, glasses, cups and plates.

The signature of the creator or the mark of the manufacturer who made them certifies the value of the exhibits: Ginari, Lalique, Bohemia, Murano, Sevres, Limoges, Meissen Rauen, Langental, Sarreguemines, Vieux Paris, Lille, Bavaria, Rosenthal, Nyon, Doccia.

The tapestries and paintings on display belong to French workshops and schools of painting. They are executed in different techniques - petit point, embroidery, oil, watercolour, gouache, with various subjects: genre scenes, birds and flowers, landscapes, portraits, compositions.

The silverware includes more than 150 pieces, distinguished by shape, size, utility (trays, candlesticks, cups, glasses, boxes, etc.). The provenance is mainly European: workshops in Austria and France. Germany, Romania, Great Britain, marked Berndorf, Beard, Wiert, Cristoff, etc.



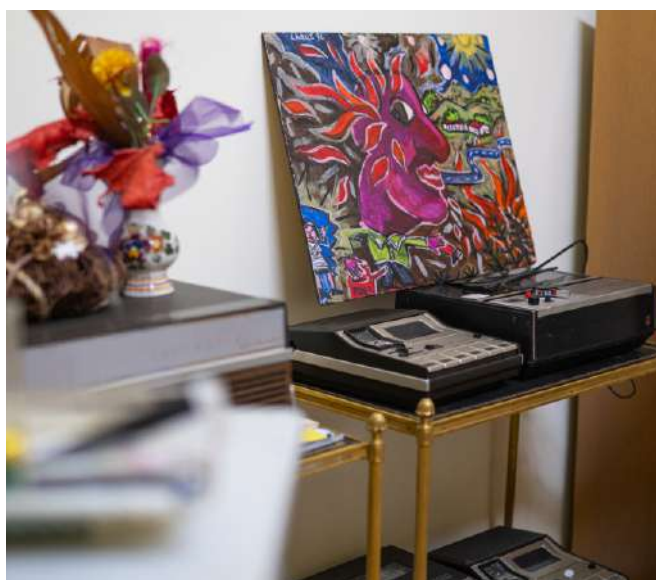


Baruşu T. Arghezi Memorial Office.

A space dedicated to study and contact with the artistic world of Bucharest in the 1940s and 1950s, the rooms of the Argheziene Literature Research Centre offer a glimpse of the home of the Bucharest intellectual: the collection of ceramics, predominantly Romanian, but also French porcelain, the classical furniture - sofas, armchairs, small pieces of decorative furniture, bookcases, chests of drawers. Carpets, paintings, the crystal mirror not absent in the living room, complete the decor.

The working room was furnished with the specific, original pieces: the desk with the typewriter, the tape recorder and the collection of tapes recorded at the Casa Radio by Tudor Arghezi, the cane and the umbrellas specific to the era.

The books published by Baruşu Arghezi, the family photographs, Doina Arghezi's drawings of the Marţişorului hill, are some of the documentary rarities found here.





CERNOVICI CASTLE

MACEA



Macea is located 23 kilometres from Arad, at the intersection of the regions of Crişana and Banat, Romania, and its main attraction is the castle and the dendrological park. Macea Castle was built in two stages, now, more than a hundred years after its completion, in the shape of the letter L. The property on which the castle now stands has belonged to several Austrian, Montenegrin and Hungarian noble families over the years.

The first part, up to the main tower, decorated with the coat of arms of the Montenegrin Cernovici family, carved in stone, was built around 1820 by Pavel Cernovici.

The right wing, beyond the tower, was built between 1862 and 1886. At that time the annex buildings were also built by the new owner of the estate, Count Karolyi.

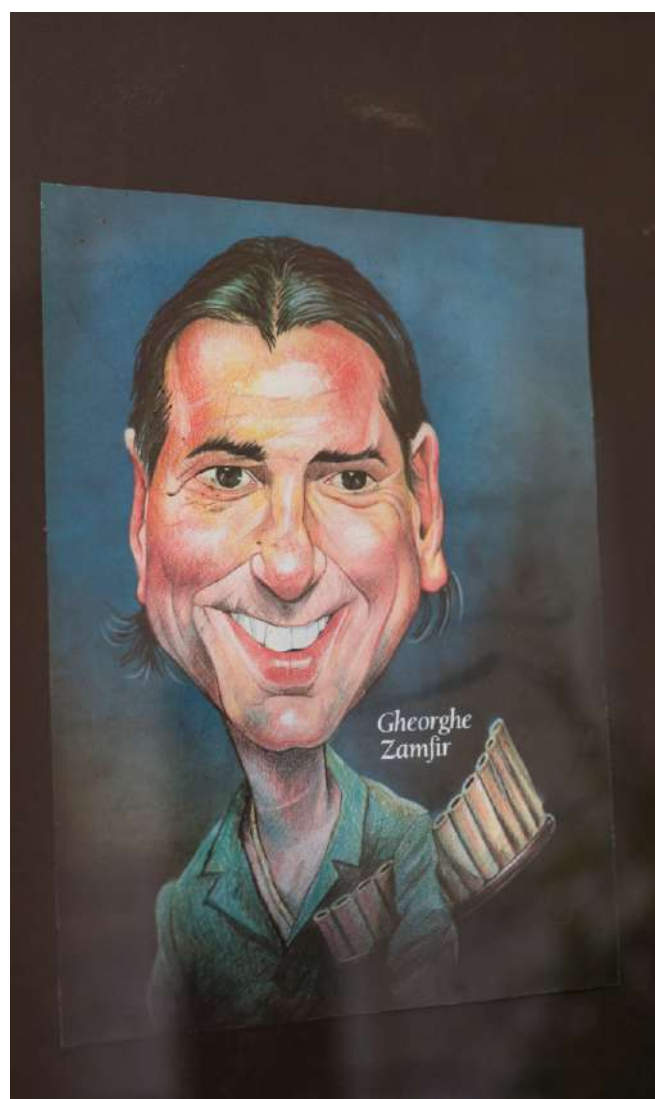




ȘTEFAN POPA-POPA'S CARICATURE EXHIBITION

The exhibition is located in Csernovics Castle and includes several works (representations of heads of state, Romanian politicians, people of art and culture) of the famous caricaturist Ștefan Popa Popa's, the first Romanian to appear in the Book of Records - 17 October 1995: he won the Book of Records award for the fastest caricatures made (in one hour he made 131 caricatures), but also for the most caricatures, color drawings made in a period of time (2,772 pieces in 10 days and 10 nights).

Popa Popa's returned to Macea as a guest and chairman of the jury at the Festival of Satire and Humour, held in Macea annually for more than 30 years.

"PAVEL COVACI" MACEA UNIVERSITY BOTANICAL GARDEN



The University Botanical Garden "Pavel Covaci" in Maceea has an area of 21.5 ha and presents in its collections over 3800 taxa.

The Garden is an institution that is responsible for teaching, research and education of the public in the field of conservation of plant biodiversity and the environment and has scientific and plant material exchange relations with over 250 similar institutions in the country and abroad.

Since May 2010, the Garden bears the name of Professor Pavel Covaci, when his bust was unveiled by the artist Aurelian Antal and placed on the main path of the garden near the "Unirii" oak tree.

The Botanical Garden of Maceea is a founding member of the Association of Botanical Gardens in Romania (AGBR) and a member of Botanic Gardens Conservation International (BGCI).





In the garden there are a number of sectors that attract visitors, and in the old hunting lodge the University has set up the Botanical Museum, the Seed Collection, the Herbarium, the Ethnographic Museum and the Hunting Museum.

The Alpinerium has been set up since the spring of 1986 and plants specific to the mountain and alpine areas are cultivated here. Some of the rarities are: the corner flower (*Leontopodium alpinum*), the rock carnation (*Dianthus callizonus*), *Dianthus spiculifolius*, the ox-eye (*Aster alpinus*), the juniper (*Pinus mugo*) and many other species.

The Garden's main path is bordered by hedges of cypress (*Buxus sempervirens*), Japanese cherry (*Prunus serrulata* 'Kiku-shidare Sakura') with drooping branches and pink, wreathed flowers that open in April-May. From place to place the path is interrupted by flower circles.

A rich collection of woody or herbaceous peonies (*Paeonia* sp.) on the right-hand side of the main path adds a splash of colour in the spring months when they are in bloom.

The sector of ornamental flowering plants in which the plants are grouped according to their geographical origin, and which of course, during the growing season, have a great attraction for the visitor. The collection was established in 1984, expanded over the years and now occupies an area of 0.2 ha and includes about 240 floricultural species.



The collections of toxic, dye, medicinal and aromatic plants serve both the student and the student who learns botany and the general public, eager to enter this world of plants, eager to know a medicinal plant to know how to harvest it from nature for their own needs, eager to know the plants that contain toxins to avoid them.

The "Legend" sector, which covers an area of 0.5 ha, is a sunny sector, which has been designed to suit children's tastes, with the plastic pruning of shrubs (boxwood, thuja), characters from stories and fairy tales known to children, such as "The goat with three kids", "The mother-in-law with three sons-in-law", "Prince Charming in tears" and the ballad "Miorița". Some of the buildings, such as the Adamclisi Monument, the Pyramids, the Sphinx, the Ancient Temple, remind us of history lessons.

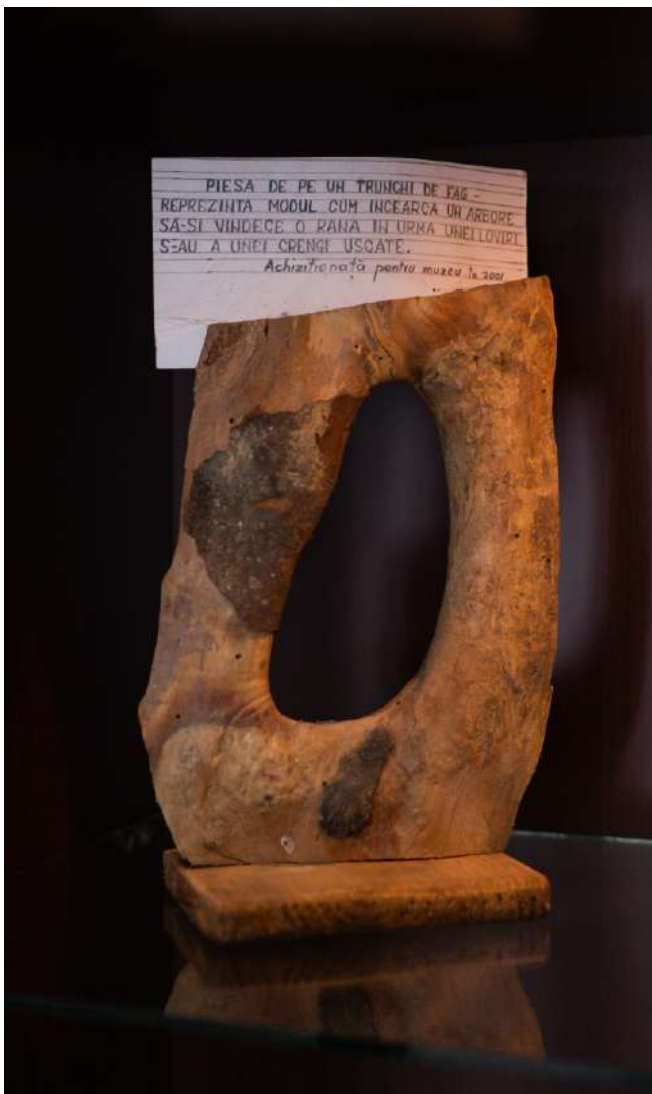
The "Diana" rose garden, established in 2011, includes more than 50 varieties of roses in different categories and is an expanding sector.

The "Eminescu" Glade contains arrangements related to the work of our great national poet, including: "The alley with the poplars without a husband", three moments from the poem "Luceafărul" (The Light of the Dawn), which are rendered with the help of pruning plants, and a clump of birch trees reminiscent of the "Silver Forest". This clearing is framed by two monumental linden trees, the linden being loved and sung by the poet.





THE BOTANICAL MUSEUM



The Botanical Museum is housed in the former hunting lodge near the Castle, which also contains the Seed Collection, the Herbarium and two plant biology laboratories.

From January 2013 to November 2014, the HURO/1101/119/1.3.1. PRO-PLANTS project was implemented by our University, through the Botanical Garden, in partnership with Corvinus University of Budapest, through the Szarvas Arboretum.

In the framework of this project the Seed Collection was set up, the Botanical Museum halls were equipped with furniture (vertical showcases, horizontal showcases and shelves), the Herbarium halls with special metal cabinets for the storage of herbarium leaves and last but not least the two laboratories were equipped.



THE SEEDS COLLECTION



Established in 2013 under the HURO /1101/119/1.3.1. PRO-PLANTS project, this collection will be expanded in the future.

The seed collection has a usable area of 110 m² and is organised as follows: space for processing fruit and other plant material and for seed conditioning; space for displaying fruit and seeds, which can be visited by the public; space for storing and preserving seeds.

The seed collection currently comprises over 2500 samples of seeds and fruit harvested from 2013 to date, both from wild flora and from plants grown in the area.

The collection area is equipped with the necessary facilities for processing the fruit and for conditioning, storing and preserving the seeds. The facilities include: 2 germinators, 3 refrigerated display cases, a seed blower, a seed dryer, a weighing scale, 40 metal shelves for storage, jars for storing seeds and more.

Maceia Botanical Garden carries out an international seed exchange with more than 250 similar institutions and publishes an annual seed catalogue (index seminum).

It has also become an attraction for the public, with a visitor's centre.



THE ETHNOGRAPHIC MUSEUM



The Ethnographic Museum was established in 1993 and has an exhibition area of 85 m². The exhibits were purchased by Prof. Dimitrie Grama from Macea, under the auspices of the Macea Cultural Ecological Association and the Macea Local Council.

Most of the objects were donated by the inhabitants of the commune, and some of them were obtained by donation from Prof. D. Schemmel. The exhibition space is provided by the "Vasile Goldiș" Western University of Arad.

Important pieces

- From the group of agricultural tools we mention: the wooden plough with iron ploughshare, the yoke for an ox, the rifle (tool for sowing corn), a miniature imitation of a fixed locomotive used for threshing grain, made by the farmer Tat Ștefan around 1930;

- Hemp processing: different types of hemp harrows, warping machines, wheel spinning forks, looms, different types of combs for combing hemp;

- clothing: suman, hammocks, shirts, shirts, lapels, dresses, etc.





THE HERBARIUM

The garden's herbarium contains several thousand sheets of botanical material mainly from the floristic areas of Arad, Bihor and Banat, but also from other parts of the country. It should also be noted that many of the herbarium species come from the spontaneous and cultivated woody and herbaceous flora of the Botanical Garden.

A collection of plants that is more particular and present in the flora of Arad is the collection of halophyte plants spread in the Socodor-Sânmartin area.

We are pleased to mention that the herbarium of the Macea University Botanical Garden also has a collection of plants collected and determined by the renowned botanist SIMONKAI L., who studied and botanized the plant species of the Arad Plain and who left botanical reference works for this floristic area of our country.

The material in the herbarium and his works were and still are valuable botanical information material for botanists in this part of our country. SIMONKAI L.'s herbarium is one of the oldest herbaria in Romania, the plants having been botanized in the last decades of the 19th century.

In 2007 the Herbarium I.D. GOGA was acquired, ca. 6000 sheets, herbarium comprising the result of the botanist's herbarium work in Banat, Bozovici area.





THE CINEGETIC MUSEUM



Located in the former hunting lodge near the Castle of Macea, established in 2011, this museum brings to the public's attention the passion for hunting, which, in these lands, had a great boom during the time of the two noble families of Macea, Cernovici and Karolyi.

The specimens exhibited in this category were prepared many years ago, and today the species are strictly protected by the Bern Convention.

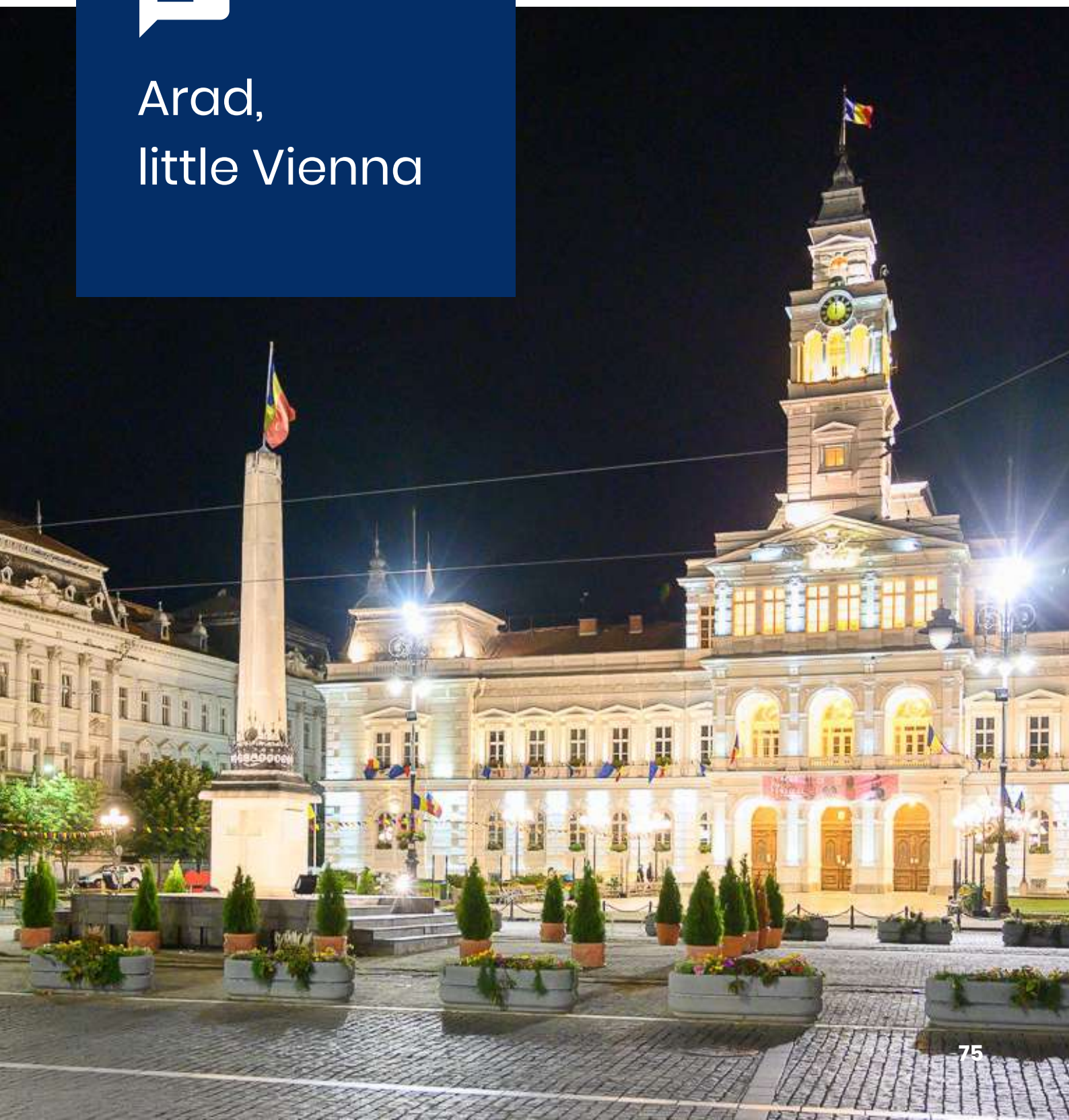
In addition to trophies, the museum displays panels showing images of game species captured by camera in their natural habitat (the images are mainly of the Socodor's red deer population), bird nests (seed crow, magpie, skua and various small birds), various objects used in hunting, various decorative objects with a hunting theme (porcelain, desk objects, paintings) and reference works.



The museum was established with the support and is still supported by the Department of Engineering and Informatics of the Faculty of Economics, Informatics and Engineering of the "Vasile Goldiș" University of Arad.

ABOUT **ARAD, LITTLE VIENNA**

Cenad Palace

Located on Bd. 73, the Palace is one of the most imposing buildings of the municipality. It was built at the end of the 19th century, by the Arad-Cenad Railway Company, according to the plans of architect Jivaszek. The building is part of the urban ensemble of the Town Hall Square and is representative of eclectic architecture, richly ornamented in classical and Renaissance style. It stands out from the other buildings because of its roof with interesting towers whose ornamentation reflects the specificity of the architecture of Arad.

The palace has decorative elements that betray its functional purpose, in particular Mercury, the god of trade, whose figure is depicted on the front of the building. After the Revolution, a large part of the space on the ground floor of Cenad Palace was given to parties, parliamentarians and associations as headquarters.



The Water Tower

The tower is 35 metres high and was commissioned in 1896. As an architectural style it completes the unified aspect of the architecture of Arad in eclectic or secession style. The tower, a solid construction of stone and brick, impresses with its massiveness and height. It is notable for the decoration of its balconies and windows. The tower was built to supply water to the growing town and to signal fires and for the rapid intervention of the municipal fire brigade.

In the second half of the last century, the town administration decided to erect a building of great importance for the life of the town, a building that is known in the memory of the people of Arad as the "Water Tower".





Administrative Palace

The administrative palace currently houses the Town Hall. It was built between 1872 and 1874 to the design of architect Pékár Ferenc. The style of the building combines Flemish Neo-Renaissance with the style of late medieval town halls. The plan of the building is in the shape of a letter U and has a 54-metre tower and the clock in the tower, brought from Switzerland in 1878, has a mechanism that plays a patriotic song at fixed times.

The lobby windows have stained glass windows representing the seasons, allegorically depicted. The square in front of the building was named Revolution Square in memory of the events of December 1989. In the centre of the square a monument and a trophy have been erected in memory of the fallen heroes of the Revolution.



Cultural Palace

The palace was built between 1911 and 1913 according to the plans of the architect Lajos Szantay from Arad. It is a combination of styles: neoclassical (façade), Corinthian (columns supporting the façade pediment), Italian Renaissance (side wings), Gothic (elements of the Huns' castle on the park side of the building).

Over the years, the magnificent concert hall has been the venue of great personalities such as Richard Strauss, Bela Bartok, George Enescu, Traian Grozăvescu, etc. The building displays a variety of styles, according to the era in which it was built. The main façade is inspired by Greek temple models. The monumental staircases, the columns with capitals and the triangular pediment decorated with a bas-relief dedicated to music (by the sculptor Geza Rubleczky).

Above the building rises a massive tower with a square base. To the right and left of the main façade are two wings with decorative staircases leading to the side entrances; each wing has a small tower with a polygonal base. The two side wings are dominated by Renaissance elements, particularly visible in the shape and decoration of the ground floor windows. On the fourth side of the building, facing the park, the most striking elements are inspired by the castle of the Hunyads.

In the interior, the floral stained glass windows in the auditorium and in the entrance hall, the decoration of the metopes, the vegetal and geometric ironwork, the chandeliers and the sconces are worthy of note.



Currently, the Cultural Palace building houses the offices of the County Museum and the State Philharmonic. The museum includes archaeology: Bronze Age, Dacian, migration and pre-medieval; history: testimonies related to the 1848 Revolution in Transylvania, the struggle for the Union (1918); ethnography; natural sciences, exhibits relating to the Arad area: mineralogy, flora and fauna; classical and contemporary Romanian art; European painting from the 17th to the 20th centuries; decorative art; history of theatre: programmes, posters, photographs, scores. The last reorganisation took place in 1979, and in 1992 it included a Natural Sciences section.

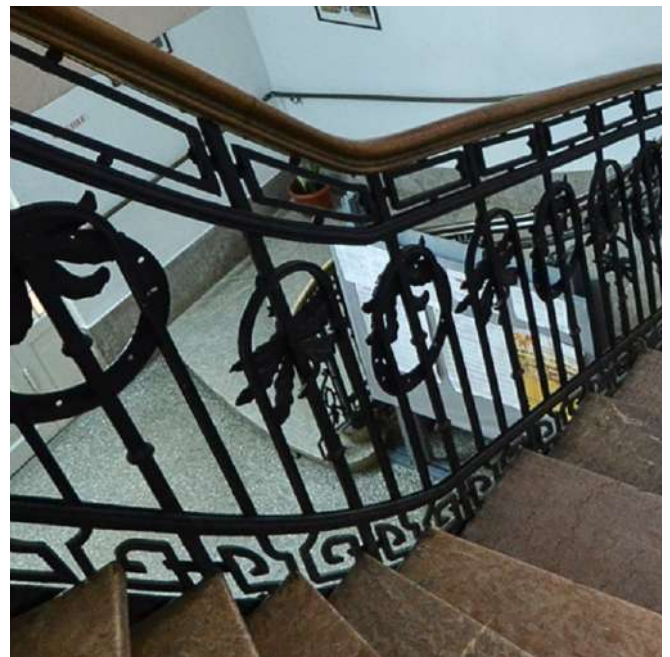


Andrenyi Palace

Andrényi Palace is located in the city centre, on Revolution Boulevard, near the Administrative Palace. It houses the classrooms of the Children's Palace of Arad.

The palace was built between 1880 and 1890 by a wealthy merchant family from Ghioroc, whose name it took. Baron Andrényi founded in 1936 a ferrous products shop in Arad, called "Golden Horse Weave".

The façade of the palace was built in neo-Romanesque style, with elements taken from the Baroque style. The U-shaped building is heavily ornamented with stucco work and the elongated sides frame a garden. The windows and doors, made of fine wood with many ornaments, have been preserved intact to this day.





Franciscan Church

During the years 1763–1783, one of the most modern fortifications in the eastern part of the Habsburg Empire was built in Arad. It functioned until the dissolution of the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy (1918) as an important strategic point of the southern defence line of the kingdom. According to the imperial plan, the new fortress of Arad was to replace the old Arad fortress and correspond to contemporary military technology.

The church inside the fortress of Arad was built by the Franciscan monks of the "Order of Saint Francis of Assisi" around 1750–1800. Later, the Citadel was built around this church.



Kohn Palace

Kohn József was a famous businessman in Arad, with a specialized training as an engineer-installer. Kohn was awarded 6 international prizes and received a state scholarship in Paris. In Arad he was the founder and president of the "Society for Sickness and Funeral Aid", to which the Arad City Hall asked for a life-size painting to be made as a token of honour.

Kohn József Palace, located at 9 Episcopiei Street, an imposing Jugendstil building, was built in 1905 according to the plans of the architect Szántay Lajos. Kohn József was an engineer-installer renowned for the innovations of his craft and was awarded 6 international prizes.



Traian Bridge

The construction of the Trajan Bridge was proposed by the city's leadership at the beginning of the 20th century. But in 1908 a project of the Austrian Railway Company was accepted. The bridge was built according to a plan by the Resita engineer Robert Toth (1857-1913), the iron structure was made by the Resita factories and the ornamentation has many "Secession" elements. At the end of the Second World War, the bridge was dynamited, but the structure was not seriously damaged and the bridge was rebuilt within a few months of the end of the war. As an industrial monument, it currently operates with weight restrictions.



The Red Church

The church was built in 1906 in neo-Gothic style, according to the plans of the architect Szántay László. In Arad it is known as the Red Church because of the decorative red bricks with which the walls were covered. The rich portal, the pointed tower, the rectangular altar and the electro-pneumatic organ, made in Timișoara, are remarkable. The main tower of the church is 46 m high.



The Art Museum

The museum building is an architectural monument (20th century) and contains Romanian art (19th-20th century Romanian plastic arts, paintings by Theodor Aman, Nicolae Grigorescu, Corneliu Baba, Nicolae Tonitza, sculptures by Dimitrie Paciurea, Romulus Ladea), but also universal art from the Italian, French, Flemish-Dutch and Hungarian schools (paintings, tapestries, porcelain, furniture).



The Fortress of Arad

It is one of the most important historical monuments in the western part of the country. Built in the second half of the 17th century, the fortress was considered one of the most impressive military fortifications of its time.

With the end of the Austro-Turkish wars in the first half of the 18th century and after the occupation of Transylvania, Banat and other territories by the Habsburg Empire, it was planned to build military fortifications in the then newly occupied regions to ensure domination in these areas.

The Vienna Chancellery also drew up a strategic plan for the construction of a belt of fortresses between the inland area close to the Empire's southern and eastern borders. These fortresses included the fortifications of Oradea, Timișoara and Arad. The plan for the fortress of Arad was personally approved by Empress Maria Theresa and her son Joseph II.

The new fortress of Arad, according to the imperial plan, was to replace the old fortress of Arad and correspond in terms of contemporary military technology. A peninsula of the Mures river (on the left bank) was chosen as the building site, which the city ceded to the military authorities. The construction of the fortress, the work of the architect Harsch, began in the summer of 1763, according to the Vauban system and is a double star-shaped construction with 6 corners, with strong defensive walls, pillboxes and other military constructions. Work took 20 years, with minor interruptions mainly due to a lack of manpower, so the fortress was completed in 1783.

TOURIST LOCATIONS IN ARAD COUNTY

Moneasa

Moneasa resort lies in a small depression at the foot of the Codru Moma Mountains. It is an ideal destination for relaxation, fresh air and hiking. The thermomineral waters (25–32°C) of the region have been used since before 1835. In 1886, the Imperial Ministry of the Interior in Vienna awarded it the title of spa resort.

Some of the mountain trails in the area lead to the Bat Cave, the Marble Quarry, the Iron Smelting Furnace Ruins, Izoi Peak, the Tinoasa Plateau or the Deznei Fortress.



Hodoș–Bodrog Monastery

Historical documents attest that this is the oldest Orthodox monastery in Romania with continuous monastic life. Historians have found evidence that it existed as early as 1177. The monastery is located in the commune of Zădăreni, about 20 minutes from Arad, on the Mureș River. The monastery church houses a miracle-working icon of the Virgin Mary and the head of the bull that, according to legend, discovered her on the site where the settlement was later built. Today, 25 monks live here.





Purgly Castle

Just 15 km from Arad, Purgly Castle is an architectural gem. The history of the building is uncertain, but it is thought to have been built at the end of the 18th century.

Built in the Secession style, the castle features a series of turrets, stained-glass windows and a richly laced exterior. The source of inspiration is thought to have been the Corvin Castle in Hunedoara. The interior cannot be visited, as it is privately owned. Or so the gentleman who lives there told us.



Ghioroc Lake

The people of Arad and Timisoara have improvised their own "coastline" on the shores of Lake Ghioroc. So they no longer have to travel hundreds of kilometres to the Black Sea coast or the beaches of Greece and can enjoy the warm days close to home. Fine sand has been brought in and palm trees have been planted to make up the beach.

Visitors can enjoy a swim or a ride on a hydrobike. For those who want a bit of adrenaline, toboggans have been installed along the lake. There are also a few cottages for those who want accommodation, terraces and a fairly large car park.





The fortress of Şoimoş

The fortress of Şoimoş was founded on the top of a hill, on the right bank of the Mures river, at the end of the 13th century. Its main role was defensive against Tatar invasions. One of those who used it as a refuge was lancu de Hunedoara. The name of the fortress is supposed to come from the activity that made it famous in the Middle Ages, the breeding of hunting falcons. Today, it is in an advanced state of decay, but its ruins have a special charm. In fact, of the three fortress ruins, Şoimoş, Şiria and Dezna seem to me the most picturesque.



Radna Monastery

The Roman Catholic monastery of Radna was built in the mid-16th century by Franciscan monks who arrived from Bosnia. A century and a half later, Lipova was besieged by the Ottomans and the church burned down. Only one thing did not burn in the whole church, the icon of Our Lady. On the site of the first church, another was built in the Baroque style between 1727 and 1826. Later, the two 30m towers were added. In 1992, Pope John Paul II gave the monastery the title of basilica minor.





Dezna Fortress

Another hilltop fortress is near Moneasa. However, its ruins are less well preserved than those of the fortresses of Șoimoș and Șiria. There is also a legend referring to the construction of the three fortresses. They are said to have been built by three power-hungry sisters who wanted to outdo each other. But as soon as they were finished, the fortifications collapsed instantly and the girls turned into three white snakes with a golden crown on their heads and a silver key in their mouths as punishment for their wicked souls.



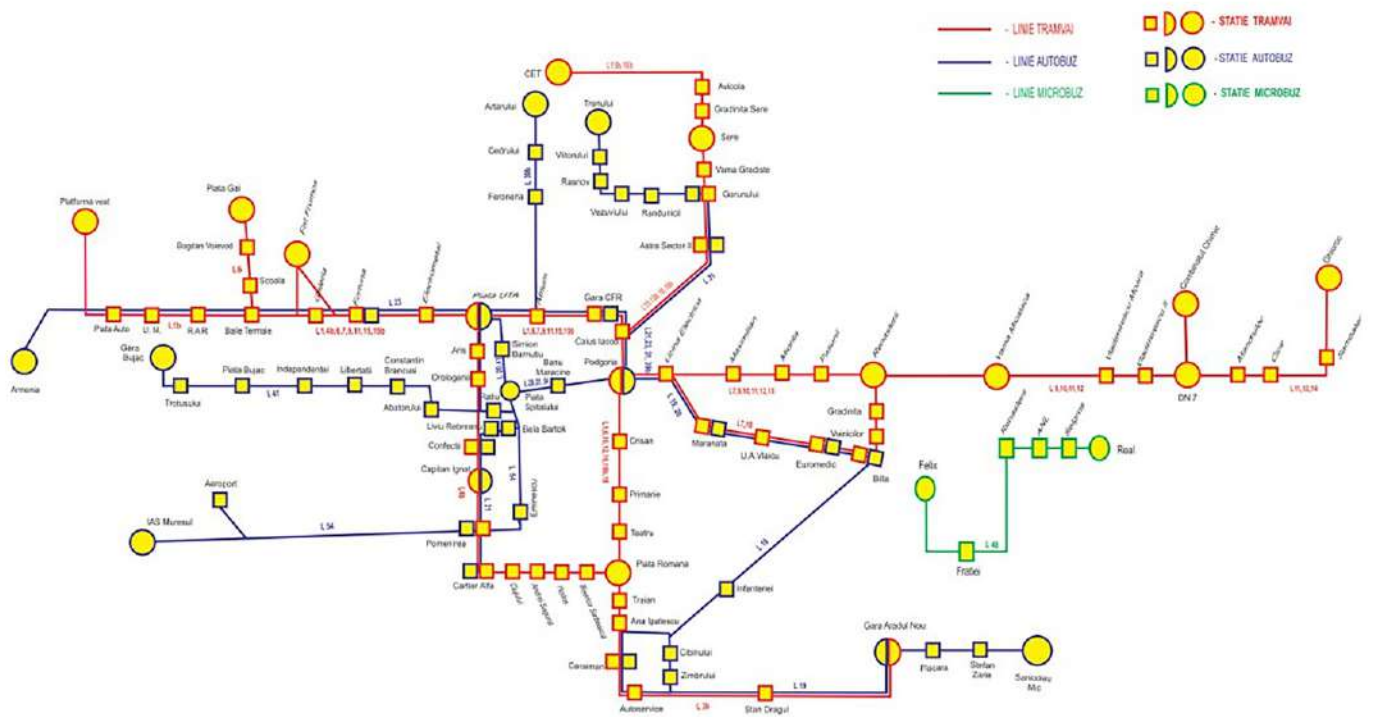
Royal Castle from Săvârșin commune

The castle of Săvârșin was built between 1650-1680 by the Forray family. Horea's serfs and rebels burned it down in 1781, at which time the entire archive was lost. The castle was rebuilt in the 19th century in neoclassical style. Săvârșin was the favourite rural settlement of Romania's royal family. Queen mother Elena left her mark on the development of the Royal Domain. Members of the family still spend the winter holidays here and are actively involved in the life of the local community.
